1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* and the Prescriptions of Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 2 Off The Beach Boats.
- 1.2 Appendix T Arbitration will apply to this regatta amended so that in Appendix T1(b) 30% Scoring Penalty will be 20% Scoring Penalty.
- 1.3 The notation [DP] in a rule in the Notice of Race means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

- 1.4 The notation [NP] means that the rule is not subject to protest by a competitor.
- 1.5 [NP] A boat may receive outside help where the Race Committee deems that the vessel and its crew require assistance in order to right a capsized vessel in order to continue racing. This changes Rule 41, RRS.

2. Advertising [DP] [NP]

- 2.1 Advertising is permitted in accordance with WS Regulation 20 (Appendix 1 Advertising).
- 2.2 The Organising Authority reserves the right to refuse advertising by any boat if it is considered offensive to public taste or if it contravenes the laws of the governments of Victoria or Australia.
- 2.3 Competitors may be required to display event sponsor's names(s)/logo(s). If required, the Organising Authority will supply these items and they shall be affixed as prescribed in the Sailing Instructions.

3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 The regatta is open to Sabre Class boats that comply with the class rules of measurement and construction of the SSAA and whose helms are current financial members of a State Sabre Association.
- 3.2 Helms shall be members of a Club affiliated with Australian Sailing.
- 3.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing an on-line entry by 16:00 on Tuesday 24 December 2023.
- 3.4 Eligibility for various divisional prizes will be governed by the competitor's age on 28 December 2023.

4. Fees

4.1 Required fees are as follows:

Adults (18 and over as at 28 December 2023): \$310.00 Youth (under 18 as at 28 December 2023): \$290.00

Combined family adult and youth entry discount: \$40.00

- 4.3 Entries lodged after 24 December 2023 may be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Authority but may not receive a regatta shirt.

- 5.1 There will be no Warning Signal made after 1530 on Wednesday 3 January 2024.
- 5.2 There will be a maximum of 10 races in the regatta with no more than four races on any one day.

6. Measurements [DP]

- 6.1 Each boat is required to hold a measurement certificate as issued by the Sabre Sailing Association of Australia Inc and, except in circumstances prescribed by 6.4, shall use a maximum of two sails, one centreboard and one rudder during the regatta which show evidence of measurement by their State Measurer at some time.
- 6.2 Competitors may be required to present the sails and foils to be used in the regatta at registration. Any measuring of sails or foils undertaken during the regatta may incur a measuring fee per boat, unless undertaken as per 6.3 below.
- 6.3 The measurer may spot check boats at any time during the Regatta. A boat notified of inspection shall follow the instructions of the Race Committee. The penalty for a boat failing to measure in accordance with the rules will be to be scored DSQ in all her completed races prior to the protest committee's decision. This changes RRS 64.1(a).
- 6.4 Damaged equipment may be replaced on written request to and approval by the Race Committee. If damage occurs during the first race of the day, equipment may be replaced between races provided a written request is lodged before the end of protest time for that day.

7. Sailing Instructions

The Sailing Instructions will be available on the McCrae Yacht Club website www.mcraeyc.com.au no later than 1700 on 24 December 2023.

8. Venue

Regatta headquarters will be at the McCrae Yacht Club -690 Point Nepean Road, McCrae, Victoria. 3938.

For Racing Area see Attachment A.

9. The Courses

The courses will consist of triangular and windward/leeward laps as set out in the Sailing Instructions.

10. Scoring

- 10.1 Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
 - (a) When fewer than six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - (c) When eight races have been completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 10.2 Scoring for the determination of results within a prize category shall be determined from the results of the overall fleet.

11. Radio Communication

A boat shall neither make radio or data transmissions while racing nor receive radio or data communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

12. Support Boats

- 12.1 Support Boats shall keep at least 100m clear of the course area and all competing boats during racing, except when asked to assist by an official from the Race Committee.
- 12.2 Support boat drivers shall hold a current Power Boat License at the time of the event, have the applicable Safety Gear and VHF Radio on board their vessel and comply with the laws of the State of Victoria.
- 12.3 Support personnel and boats shall make themselves available at all times while afloat to assist the race committee in the case of an emergency or rescue, as directed in person by a race officer or via VHF Radio. RRS 37.

12.4 d) The penalty for failing to comply with these requirements may, after protest, be the disqualification of all boats associated with the infringing support personnel.

- Presentation night dinner for the competitor


Additional tickets will be available for purchase at time of entry.
